Policy:

- I. Students may take a non-developmental undergraduate-level course no more than three times, whether to improve a passing grade or to repeat a course in which grades of 'W,' 'I,' 'F,' 'U,' or 'T' were earned. If a student cannot successfully complete a required course after three attempts, that student will be academically suspended from the College until the course requirement is satisfied with an equivalent course at another institution or until the student changes his/her major to one that does not require the repeated course.
- II. Developmental courses (as defined in <u>Policy 4.42</u>) may be attempted only two times. The same consequences as referenced above will apply after the second unsuccessful attempt.
- III. Students may take a graduate-level course no more than two times, whether to improve a passing grade or to repeat a course in which grades of 'W,' 'I,' 'F,' 'U,' or 'T' were earned. If a student cannot successfully complete a required graduate-level course after two attempts, the student will be academically dismissed from the program.
