Veterans Education Benefits

Veterans Education Benefits are available to eligible students who have served in the military, are on active duty, or are enlisted in the Reserves or National Guard. Also, students who are dependents of a veteran with a service connected death or 100% disability are eligible to apply.

Veterans Education Benefits and other gift aid are determined by many factors; do not assume you won't qualify. To assist you in planning your educational future, you should determine if you are eligible, how much you will receive, and the timeline for receiving the benefits.

Tuition & Fees

Tuition and fees are charged on a per-credit basis. Average rates are provided to help you estimate the cost to attend for one year.

The lab hour fee is \$34 per lab hour and is not included in the per credit cost.
