[WorldCat](#) is a catalog of books and other materials owned by libraries located around the world including the Penn College Library. Don't forget to limit the language to “English” and the type to “books.” Books not in our library can be requested by clicking on [Borrow from another library](#) .



[Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center](#) covers controversial social issues, such as terrorism, stem cell research, and assisted suicide. It brings together all the information that is needed to fully understand an issue: pro and con viewpoint articles, reference articles that provide context, full-text magazines, academic journals, newspapers, primary source documents, government and organizational statistics, multimedia, including images and podcasts, links to hand-selected web sites, and more.

CURRENT ISSUES REFERENCE SHELF PLUS

[Current Issues Reference Shelf Plus](#) covers over 600 topics with full-text articles from key publications on social, scientific, health, political and global issues with links to primary resources and helpful Web sites.



ProQuest

This database contains abstracts and full text articles covering popular, scholarly, trade and news publications in general and interdisciplinary topics.

Remember to use [Journal Locator](#) to find out if an article you found a citation to in one database is available full-text in another.



Remember to use [ILLiad \(Interlibrary Loan\)](#) to request an item for which we have no access in our library. Articles are usually emailed in 2-3 days; books may take up to 2 weeks.
