United States Patents

USE THE 2 COMPUTERS CLOSEST TO THE RESTROOMS (LOL 14 and LOL 15), NEAR THE SCANNER. These 2 specific computers can download the patent images needed. The other computers, including reference, cannot at this time.

If searching by patent number, remember to include the commas.

When the patent is retrieved, an abstract of the patent, background information, history, claims, etc. will be given.

To view the entire patent, including images, click on the red “Images” icon above the patent information.

To Print:

Once the patent is retrieve, click on the printer icon closest to the patent itself, not the printer icon on the browser toolbar. All pages of the patent will be printed.

World Patents

World patents can be retrieved from The European Patent Office at this URL:

<http://ep.espacenet.com>

On the right, click “Worldwide 30 Million Documents”.

Find “Publication Number”, and type in the patent number.

For a world patent, a “WO” patent, remember that the O next to the W is a letter.

For example, type wo9952950.

Click on “Search”.

Check off and click on the patent number.

The title of the patent, an abstract, and other information will appear.

Make a decision:

Check, if available, the small square box before the US “Patent Number” at the top of the form.

Or, check the small square box before the “Requested Patent” number, the wo99052950. (Note: your number changed from wo9952950 to wo99052950. The 99 represents a year, 1999. The additional zero is a place holder in case there are more than 99,999 patents entered into the database.)

Click inside the main part of the document, itself, (light yellow background). This will select the frame to be printed. Press the printer icon. Only 1 page will be printed. (This will prove that the patent entered in the worldwide patent database is the same patent with a different US patent number.)

Click on the “Patent Number” or the “Requested Patent”, wo99052950. The first page of the patent will appear. Print it, a single page at a time (see directions below).

To Print:

Once the patent is retrieve, click on the printer icon closest to the patent itself, not the printer icon on the browser toolbar. A single page will be printed.

Arrow to the next page. (The arrows are located about 4 inches to the right of the red thumbprint.) Print.

Repeat as necessary.
