




Intro-MECH is a one-year, entry-level

training curriculum of core mechatronics topics for employees hired or transitioning into positions in industrial maintenance. It is also appropriate for current technicians needing to expand their technical knowledge base. Intro-MECH is an ideal preparation course for technicians who may become candidates for Penn College's advanced four-year Mechatronics Technician apprenticeship program.

Intro-MECH is aligned to eight different NIMS Industrial Technology Maintenance (ITM) credentials. This training consists of 144 total hours of instruction covering four core mechatronics competencies: Mechanical Systems, Fluid Power – Hydraulics/Pneumatics, Electrical Systems, and Electrical Controls (PLCs & VFDs).

Designed to advance the technical knowledge and skill sets of fulltime maintenance technicians
