State-of-the-Art Labs

Equipment within our paramedic labs includes:

- ◇ Ambulance simulator
- ◇ Vehicle rescue simulator
- ◇ Advanced life support (ALS) equipment, including iSimulate monitors, Lifepak 15s, and video laryngoscopes
- ◇ Apartment learning lab for simulated in-home care
- ◇ Dedicated space to simulate the full emergency continuum, including a car accident, ambulance transport, and ER transfer of care
