

**PATHWAY AGREEMENT BETWEEN
PENNSYLVANIA COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY**

AND

BURLINGTON COUNTY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY

This agreement establishes a mechanism for students of the **Burlington County Institute of Technology (BCIT) Allied Health CTE program** to earn credit for the below defined coursework at Penn College in [Allied Health, A.A.S.](#)

Burlington County Institute of Technology Coursework	Penn College Coursework	Number of Credit(s)
Health and Wellness course	Fitness & Wellness Elective (FITELC)	1 Credit
Medical Terminology I & II	Medical Terminology Survey (MTR100)	1 Credit*
Patient Care Technician/Certified Clinical Medical Assistant I & II AND PCT/CMA Certification	Allied Health Directed Electives (AHSELC)	6 Credits

*Note that MTR100 is a required course in other Penn College majors, some of which use the course as part of a competitive ranking system. Should a BCIT student receive credit for MTR100 as part of this agreement and change to one of the competitive admission majors, such as Physical Therapist Assistant, the actual grades earned in the BCIT coursework (Medical Terminology I & II) will be used to calculate ranking points.

Additional Transfer Information

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements to enroll as an Allied Health (AHS) student.
- Students must complete BCIT coursework with a grade of C or better (2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Penn College will accept BCIT coursework for Penn College credit for students who enroll at the College within two (2) academic years of graduation from BCIT.
- Students must submit the following to Penn College prior to enrollment to receive credit for their BCIT Allied Health CTE program and achieving PCT/CMA certification:
 - their final official BCIT transcript to the Penn College Admissions office
 - the BCIT *Articulation Agreement Completion Form*, completed and signed by BCIT administrators, noting completion of specific competencies and coursework to the Penn College Admissions office
 - a copy of active Patient Care Technician/Certified Medical Assistant certification to the Penn College Admissions office
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through BCIT for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- Credits will post on the student’s official academic transcript upon the successful completion of twelve (12) credits of academic work at Penn College. Prior to completion of twelve (12) credits,

for advising and scheduling purposes, approved credits will show on working copies of the student's academic transcript and on the student's graduation profile. Whether Penn College credits will be accepted by another college or university is at the discretion of the receiving college or university.
