

WELCOME TO WILLIAMSPORT




Put your financial plan in place.

How can I help my student?



Your student should also complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **studentaid.gov**. The priority deadline is March 1 for fall and this form is required to be considered for federal aid.



Encourage your student to complete the Penn College Scholarship Application. By filling out one form, they'll be considered for 350+ opportunities. Awarding begins March 1.



Don't forget about external scholarships. Lots of organizations like professional associations, community foundations, employers, and places of worship offer scholarships. Be resourceful and take advantage of all possibilities.

MISSED THE PRIORITY DEADLINE?

Students should submit the FAFSA as soon as possible. The Penn College Scholarship Application remains open until the start of the semester for fall students and October 1 for spring students.
