Additional Transfer Information

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Students must complete coursework with a grade of C or better (2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Students must score "advanced" on the National Occupational Competency Institute (NOCTI) written and skills examinations.
- Penn College will accept Western Montgomery Career and Technology Center coursework for Penn College credit for students who enroll at the College within two (2) academic years of graduation from Western Montgomery Career and Technology Center.
- Students must submit their final official Western Montgomery Career and Technology Center transcript to Penn College prior to enrollment in order to receive credit for their Western Montgomery Career and Technology Center coursework.
- Students must submit a copy of their NOCTI written and skills examination results to Penn College prior to enrollment.
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Western Montgomery Career and Technology Center for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- Credits will post on the student's official academic transcript upon the successful completion of twelve (12) credits of academic work at Penn College. Whether Penn College credits will be accepted by another college or university is at the discretion of the receiving college or university.
