

PATHWAY AGREEMENT FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, CAREER TECHNOLOGY CENTERS (CTC), AND CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) SENDING INSTITUTIONS BETWEEN

PENNSYLVANIA COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY

AND

CLARION COUNTY CAREER CENTER

This Pathway Agreement establishes a mechanism for students of Clarion County Career Center to earn credit for the below defined coursework at Pennsylvania College of Technology in Diesel Technology (A.A.S.), Electric Power Generation Technology: Diesel Emphasis (A.A.S.), Heavy Construction Equipment Technology: Technician Emphasis (A.A.S.), Heavy Construction Equipment Technology: Caterpillar Emphasis (A.A.S.), and Heavy Construction Equipment Technology: Operator Emphasis (A.A.S.), and Diesel Truck Maintenance (certificate).

Additional Transfer Information

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Students must complete coursework with a grade of B or better (3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Penn College will accept Clarion County Career Center coursework for Penn College credit for students who enroll at the College within two (2) academic years of graduation from Clarion County Career Center.
- Students must submit their final official Clarion County Career Center transcript to Penn College prior to enrollment in order to receive credit for their Clarion County Career Center coursework.
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Clarion County Career Center for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- Credits will post on the student's official academic transcript upon the successful completion of twelve (12) credits of academic work at Penn College. Whether Penn College credits will be accepted by another college or university is at the discretion of the receiving college or university.
