This agreement establishes a mechanism for graduates of Johnson College – Radiologic Technology A.A.S. and Physical Therapist Assistant A.A.S. degrees to earn credit for the below defined coursework at Penn College.

In addition to the program-specific credits and transfer based on the earned associate's degree, students may be eligible to receive transfer credit for specific courses per Penn College's Transfer Course Equivalency Database (https://as400sec.pct.edu/CourseCrosswalk/).

At the present time, the courses below are required by **Johnson College's Radiologic Technology** and/or **Physical Therapist Assistant** majors and are listed as equivalent to Penn College courses required in the bachelor's degree; that list may change over time, and additional courses can be evaluated for equivalency upon request.

^{*}Additional course-specific stipulations:

- BIO107, 108, 109, and 110 must be transferred as a group to satisfy BIO115 and BIO125.
 However, the second science elective requirement in HLA requires only 3 credits; BIO110 lab will be applied within the block of pre-program requirements.
- For the PTA program, the ART131 course will only be used as ARP elective if not used in the Block area in Table 1.
- A course may only satisfy a program requirement in one of the three categories represented above (i.e., courses cannot be applied to the degree progress audit more than once).

Through the options identified above, graduates of **Johnson College's Radiologic Technology** major can transfer up to 70 credits toward the Healthcare Leadership & Administration major, with as few as 50 credits left to complete to earn the bachelor's degree. Graduates **of Johnson College's Physical Therapist Assistant** major can transfer up to 66 credits toward the Healthcare Leadership & Administration major, with as few as 54 credits remaining.

Additional Transfer Information

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Students must complete all coursework with a grade of C or better (2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Johnson College for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- The student's academic degree progress audit will be provided after official evaluation of all transfer credit. The degree progress audit will determine graduation requirements.
- Students must complete a minimum of 36 credits of coursework at Penn College.
- Individuals must provide an *official* transcript of all college coursework and documentation of current professional credential (if applicable).
