#### ☐ MAKE LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

#### **On-Campus Housing Fills Fast**

At Penn College, you'll find a variety of on- and off-campus housing options. If you're hoping to live on campus, we recommend reserving your spot as soon as possible after confirming your intent to enroll. We also have an extensive inventory of approved off-campus options, all located within the Penn College Police patrol zone.

Complete the housing contract for on-campus housing and submit your deposit at access.pct.edu.

#### ☐ SELECT A DINING PLAN

If you're living on campus and you completed your housing contract, this step is done. If you're living off-campus or are commuting, you'll have the option to purchase a meal plan to use while you're here.

#### □ UPLOAD STUDENT ID PHOTO

Send us your photo now and we'll have your student ID ready when you come to campus.

#### □ REVIEW YOUR SCHEDULE

We'll create your first-semester schedule based on the requirements of your program, input from your academic school, placement results, and possible transfer and alternative credits.

#### ☐ GET HYPED FOR NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

New Student Orientation is designed to help you and your supporters prepare for the road ahead. New Student Orientation looks a little different for students beginning in fall vs. those starting in the spring. Watch your email for more information.

#### □ SUBMIT FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

We need your final, official transcripts before you can start classes. This applies whether you recently graduated from high school or just completed a semester at another college.

Have your transcript sent directly from your previous high school or college to admissions@pct.edu.

Planning to bring your car to campus? While there's plenty of parking, you'll need to purchase a permit.

Parking passes are available for advanced purchase in the weeks leading up to the semester at access.pct.edu.

#### □ PAY YOUR BILL

You'll receive an email at your Penn College account when your bill is ready. Pay by the deadline to avoid late fees.

Bills can be paid at access.pct.edu.

#### □ COMPLETE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All incoming students must submit proof of immunizations prior to your arrival on campus.


#### ☐ GET BOOKS, SUPPLIES, & LAPTOP

#### 1. Submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Required for any federal aid, the FAFSA opens in October for the following year. After completing your FAFSA, you can check your Student Portal to see your total award value. Learn more at pct.edu/fafsa.

#### 2. Complete the Penn College Scholarship Application.

By submitting one scholarship application, you'll put your name in the running for 350+ unique, stackable scholarships. Apply at pct.edu/scholarships.

#### 3. Take advantage of external scholarships.

Spend time seeking out scholarships beyond those offered through Penn College. Many employers and civic organizations have awards for students just like you! See more at pct.edu/external-scholarships.

#### 4. Consider loan options.

Most students and parents take advantage of loan programs. Explore options at pct.edu/loans.

#### 5. Familiarize yourself with tuition discounts.

Application opens **December 1** for the for spring students.

#### **DEFERRED PAYMENT PLAN**

Qualified students can submit a down payment and break their tuition cost into four installments. See details at pct.edu/paymentplan.









Most of these scholarships are renewable for two years for an associate-degree seeking student and four years for a bachelor-degree seeking student. The Penn College Transfer Student Scholarship is renewable for up to three years.

#### CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

If you're attending a career and technical program in Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Maryland, or Connecticut, this award is the perfect motivation to continue your hands-on education. Eligible students can get a \$2,000 annual scholarship.

#### PENN COLLEGE TRANSFER STUDENT **SCHOLARSHIP**

Exclusively for select transfer students, this \$2,500 annual award celebrates the transfer journey and the immersive learning experience you'll enjoy at Penn College.

#### SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP

If you attended one of our overnight career exploratory summer programs, you're eligible for a \$1,000 annual scholarship. If you came for two programs, you'll get \$2,000 in annual scholarships.

#### SKILLSUSA SCHOLARSHIP

If you're a state or national SkillsUSA winner, you'll be awarded a \$2,500 scholarship for first place, \$1,500 for second place, and \$1,000 for third place.
