Additional Transfer Information

- Students must submit a completed Penn College application.
 - Note: When selecting the Building Automation Engineering Technology major on the Penn College application, students will be prompted to select a secondary major that most closely aligns with their associate's degree. For purposes of this agreement, students should select the **Electrical Construction (EB)** major. Once the completed associate degree from Johnson College has been verified by the Registrar's Office, the secondary major will be removed.
- Students must provide an **official** transcript of all college coursework.
- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Johnson College applicants must have a minimum final cumulative GPA of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale). MAT-101 must be completed with a grade of C or higher in order to receive credit for the course.
- Students must complete a minimum of 36 credits at Penn College for coursework prescribed in the final four semesters of the student's baccalaureate curriculum, as provided in the [College Catalog](#).
- Students transferring to Penn College are eligible and will be considered for scholarship opportunities the same as currently enrolled students. Students must meet the application deadlines for scholarships for the fall and spring enrollment. Students must be accepted to the College to be eligible.
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Johnson College for the terms of this Articulation Agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
