


Gift From Lycoming Engines Boosts College's Aviation Instruction

Longtime Pennsylvania College of Technology partner Lycoming Engines has donated 15 aircraft engines to be used for instructional purposes in the college's aviation majors. The donation, valued at \$317,500, will benefit students enrolled in the aviation maintenance technology bachelor's degree, the aviation technology associate degree

and the aviation maintenance certificate major. Over 100 Penn College alumni are employed by <u>Lycoming Engines</u>, a leading piston-engine producer for the general aviation industry that employs approximately 400 people.
