


Put your financial plan in place.

How can I help my student?



Have your student complete the Financial Aid Authorization (FAA) form, which is required to receive any financial aid at Penn College. This is located on the applicant dashboard and allows us to review other financial aid applications including the FAFSA.



Your student should also complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **studentaid.gov**. The priority deadline is March 1 and this form is required to be considered for federal aid.



Encourage your student to complete the Penn College Scholarship Application. By filling out one form, they'll be considered for 350+ opportunities. The priority deadline for this application is also March 1.



Don't forget about external scholarships. Lots of organizations like employers, clubs, places of worship, civic groups, and community foundations offer scholarships. Be resourceful and take advantage of all possibilities.

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
We believe that everyone should have access to a college education. Our open admissions policy gives every student an opportunity to explore, grow, succeed, and reach their career goals.
