Join us this summer for an immersive experience focused on the world of cybersecurity. Hosted by Pennsylvania College of Technology and supported by the National Science Foundation and the National Security Agency, GenCyber 2024 is a national initiative designed to introduce you to a lineup of meaningful and actionable cybersecurity concepts that can be shared in your classroom.

Educators in all subject areas currently teaching grades 5 to 12 in the state of Pennsylvania are invited to apply.

Participants must be proficient in Microsoft Word and have the ability to search the internet.

- An understanding of ethical responsibilities and implications of cybersecurity
- Lesson plans infused with cybersecurity concepts related to your subject area

- 14 hours of pre-camp virtual instruction
- Weeklong in-person summer camp
- 10 hours of post-camp activities

Includes the oneday Cyber Challenge competition hosted by Penn College for teachers and a small group of their students in Fall 2024.

Remaining follow-up hours are virtual.

- Upon completion, participants will receive a \$1,500 stipend and be eligible for professional development for Act 48 credit.
- Breakfast, lunch, and snacks will be provided during summer camp week.
- Free on-campus housing for summer camp week will be provided for those unable to commute.
