SGA OVERVIEW

WHO WE ARE

The Student Government Association (SGA) of Pennsylvania College of Technology represents the voice of the student body. Guided by the principles of democracy, self-representation, and active student involvement, SGA serves as the central hub for student leadership, fostering collaboration between students, faculty, and administration. Our members include an Executive Board, Senate, and Assembly, each working to uphold the interests of all Penn College students.

WHAT WE DO

SGA is dedicated to enhancing the student experience in several key areas:

- Advocacy: We serve as a liaison between the student body and college administration, ensuring that student perspectives shape institutional policies and initiatives.
- Representation: Through our elected Senators and Assembly representatives, SGA brings forward the concerns and ideas of all students, including those from academic schools and recognized student organizations.
- Support: We promote and fund student-led programs, events, and organizations, contributing to academic, social, and personal development.

 Engagement: SGA provides a forum for students to exchange ideas and collaborate on initiatives that improve campus life.

INITIATIVES & GOALS

SGA is committed to the continuous improvement of the Penn College community. Key initiatives include:

- Student Advocacy and Diversity:
 Supporting the voices of diverse populations through positions such as Senators at Large for Diversity, Health and Wellness, and Student Veterans.
- Organizational Support: Reviewing and approving new student organizations while providing funding and resources to enhance their impact.
- Community Engagement: Hosting awareness programs and events that connect students with leadership opportunities and promote campuswide collaboration.
- Policy Development: Proposing and voting on amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws to ensure governance remains relevant and effective.
- Transparency and Communication:
 Utilizing social media and public
 relations to keep students informed
 and involved in SGA activities.

EVENTS

During the 2024-2025 Academic Year, the Student Government Association (SGA) planned, marketed, and executed a wide variety of events catered to the Penn College Community to increase our public presence. This section includes our past and future events.

PAST EVENTS

- Friday Night Fest (Aug. 16): SGA
 participated in this Welcome Week
 event, speaking with students to
 promote the organization and its
 mission.
- Swag Crawl (Aug. 15 & 17): SGA hosted bonus tables for two days, offering giveaways to engage with students and boost participation.
- Part-Time Job & Club Fair (Sept. 5):
 SGA connected with students at the fair, promoting involvement in clubs and campus activities.
- FYE Presentations (Sept. 9): Presented to First-Year Experience classes, introducing SGA's roles, responsibilities, and opportunities for new students.
- Student Gov't Games (Sept. 10):
 Collaborated with Sigma Pi for a day of fun lawn games, fostering engagement with passing students.
- Pizza & Pool with the Police (Sept. 16):
 Brought students and campus police together to build connections and encourage dialogue in a casual setting.

- Fountain Dyeing (Sept. 26): SGA members dyed the Veterans' Fountain outside ATHS as part of preparations for the Wildcat Weekend.
- October Open House (Oct. 5): SGA
 Senators interacted with prospective students and distributed giveaways across campus and the Earth Science Center.
- Penn State All-U Day Game (Oct. 5): SGA Board Members represented Penn College during halftime at the Penn State vs. UCLA football game.
- Arc Asylum (Oct. 24): Partnered with the American Welding Society for their Halloween-themed event in the CAL Building.
- Trick or Treat on 3rd Street (Oct. 30):
 Worked with Residence Life and
 student clubs to hand out candy to
 local families and the community.
- November Open House (Nov. 6):
 Continued October Open House activities, connecting with prospective students and sharing SGA resources.
- Bystander Intervention Training (Nov. 20): Partnered with the Office of Student Engagement to educate students on safe intervention strategies during SGA's biweekly meeting.
- Cookie Decorating with Provost Flynn (Dec. 4): Hosted a festive cookie decorating event with Provost Flynn during SGA's general meeting.

MEETINGS

SGA conducted a total of 97 meetings during Fall 2024, reflecting its commitment to fostering collaboration and addressing student concerns. This included 7 General Meetings, 15 Executive Board Meetings, and 75 Advisor Meetings.

Advisor Meetings: Held weekly between individual executive board members and faculty advisors, these meetings were a space for brainstorming, gaining insights, and seeking guidance on various initiatives. They ensured that SGA activities were well-informed and aligned with the broader goals of Penn College.

MEETINGS OVERVIEW

General Meetings: Held every other Wednesday in the Mountain Laurel Room at the PDC or Penn's Inn in the CC, these meetings brought together SGA members and students to discuss campus-wide issues and initiatives. Students were encouraged to attend and share proposals or ideas to improve the Penn College community. The schedule for Spring 2025 General Meetings is available for those looking to get involved.

Executive Board Meetings: These meetings occurred weekly, either virtually via Microsoft Teams or in the Tiadaghton Room at the PDC. They served as a platform for the Executive Board to collaborate with faculty Advisors, addressing sensitive or strategic topics and planning events to benefit the campus community.



PRESIDENT HAYDEN LESTER

"As President I serve as the primary representative and spokesperson for the SGA, bridging communication between students, the college administration, and the community. This role involves presiding over meetings, coordinating events, and mentoring the executive board while fostering a positive student environment at Penn College."

KEY INITITAIVES

- Organized 3 summer planning meetings with the 2024-2025 executive board to organize roles and prepare for the upcoming academic year.
- Led 2 summer strategy meetings with SGA advisors to coordinate the executive board's goals and visions for the academic year, along with introducing the role and responsibilities to incoming Executive Vice President Olivia Magann.
- Conducted two process improvement sessions with Vice President of Internal Relations Ralph Courtright III and a marketing strategy session with Vice President of Public Relations Kaylena Harrell in September.
- Represented the SGA at the Shared Governance Strategic Work Session on 09/20: Advocated for student perspectives and reinforced the

importance of student representation in campus decision-making.

- Represented the SGA at two College Council meetings in September and October to advocate for student concerns and provide updates on SGA activities.
- Met with Penn College President Mike Reed in November to discuss SGA's progress and upcoming initiatives that led to an SGA email addressing discrimination on campus.
- Participated in the All College Meeting on 11/14: Represented SGA at President Reed's mid-semester address, engaging with leadership and identifying opportunities to advocate for student interests.
- Organized the executive board retreat on 11/15, to celebrate the semester's achievements and socialize with board members.
- Led 13 executive board meetings to oversee planning and address agenda items presented by members of the Executive Board, the Student Body, and the College Administration.

VICE PRESIDENT

OLIVIA MAGANN

"As Executive Vice President, I oversee the Senate, ensuring Senators are equipped with the tools, guidance, and support they need to succeed. I also manage the Elections and Recognitions Committees and work closely with the Provost to address student needs."

KEY INITIATIVES

- Provost Engagement: Partnered with Provost Joanna Flynn to create the Cookies and Conversation event.
 Brought up student concerns about food quality and signage, with the Provost agreeing to contact Mark Leo to address the issues. Reviewed Anthology scheduling, gathered feedback, and planned to reintroduce SGA's mission college-wide.
- Senator Support: Discussed senator roles, goals, and expectations during dean meetings. Established monthly senator reports covering office hours, meetings, and programming.
 Coordinated document transfers and reassigned responsibilities following a senator's resignation. Created a comprehensive club contact list for each Academic Division.
- Student Advocacy: Addressed dining hall food quality issues and clarified ambiguities in signage raised by students.

- Club Assistance: Supported the Mechatronics and Electrical Organization (MEO) with their club application process, including drafting their constitution and by-laws. Assisted the American Welding Society (AWS) with event planning and the VEMS system to prepare for Arc Asylum.
- Recruitment Efforts: Rejected unqualified senator applications and sent emails to Deans and Assistant Deans to recruit new Senators, enhancing outreach efforts.
- Future Planning: Discussed an SGA video project aimed at improving student understanding of SGA's purpose, with plans to resume the project in Spring 2025.


